2008 Ski Trips

All day/weekend ski trips depart from 700 New Rodgers Rd. in Levittown 19056 at the Middletown Township Maintenance Bldg., former police bldg. (directions and map on the web site). Prices include lift tickets, transportation on a lavatory-equipped bus, videos and refreshments on the bus, driver's tip, lodging, meals, and a box dinner on the return trip home. Friday departure times for weekend trips vary: Okemo/Stratton 4:30 pm, Sunday River/Wildcat 4:00 pm and Stowe/Sugarbush 4:30 pm. Most accommodations can be priced for double, triple or quad occupancy. Indicate your choice on the waiver form.

Children 18 years or younger may qualify for rate reductions when staying with their parents. Agreements with lodges vary, so check with Maureen to see what is most beneficial to your family.

PLEASE NOTE that you must be a member to go on ski trips and you must fill out a color-coded waiver form with your initial deposit. If you make the required 50% deposit 60 days in advance of the trip, you receive a \$10 discount off of the total cost of each weekend trip and are entered in the raffle for a \$100 discount. Balance is due a minimum of 2 weeks prior to departure.

OKEMO and STRATTON, VERMONT

Ski 2 days. We are looking forward to going back for the fifth time to the *Hartness House*, Vermont's historic inn, originally the home of James Hartness, inventor, astronomer and Governor of Vermont in 1920.
