The 2004-05 ski season has, sadly, come to a close. But lifetime memories have been etched into our mind's eye. Thanks to the many (kind and wonderful) members of our club, we have once again reached a successful conclusion of another ski season. In all, 292 members supported our trips. Our trips this year accounted for 30 days of skiing at 16 different ski areas and 11 or over one third were in powder! Can't wait until next year.

Our strategy for selecting where to ski was successful this season. Okemo and Sunapee were chosen first, because of their extensive snowmaking and deep till grooming. Stowe makes most of their snow in January and February and has a good base by then, plus the greenhouse effect (-14 °) gave us comfortable skiing weather. At Elk you can always depend on either: rain, sleet, snow, ice, thunder, lightning, or sun along with serious grooming. This year it was sunshine and nice 20°-30° temperatures. Sunday River's crowds are virtually non-existent on President's weekend. Plus their snowmaking and grooming always assure us that there will be good skiing. Going to Canada in March means good snow cover, plus not so cold temperatures. We received a bonus this year of fresh snow. The crowds were almost non-existent.

Going out West in March and April can best be described as *unbelievable*. This time of year Aspen generally receives great quantities of snow. We were not disappointed as we received 20-30 inches.

The last three Christmas-Winter Vacations we have skied in the West; twice at Steamboat and once at Big Sky,

Montana. We have been fortunate to have not so cold weather and good snow.

# 2005 Trip Recap

#### STEAMBOAT

Our plane was de-iced in Philadelphia, but everything else was smooth sailing for the thirty-five of us. Our Phoenix condos were perfectly located - through the Ptarmigan property, and we were on the slopes. Everything was open and in good condition. We had one day of fresh powder, enjoyed by all, and comfortable 20° temperatures the remainder of the week. Even though we didn't all get to go, one evening we enjoyed the vicarious pleasure of untracked powder in the videos of Phil and Bob's Snocat Skiing Adventure.

Apres skiers at *Slopeside* and *Bear River Bar & Grill* consumed many a beverage, many a day. Our group dinner was three miles away in town at the *Steamboat Yacht Club* on the Yampa River. Everyone raved about the food. Our annual New Year's Eve party, hosted by the Waltz and Mitchell condos was a great success. We all agreed Steamboat was a great place to start our ski season!

#### OKEMO AND SUNAPEE

Thanks to the "deep tilling\*" method of grooming, Okemo's renowned trail maintenance saved the weekend. otherwise known as the "Opportunists Weekend". Due to lack of snow and unlack of rain the week before, there were **no** glades, **no** bumps and an Eagles game on Sunday at 1:00. There were two new high speed (6-pack) replacement lifts in Tignes Val Claret with a totally new lift in Le Fornet opening in 2006. This year we had eliminated the last night stay in either Lyon or Geneva and returned to the US on Saturday. 
fine wine. We watched the snowfalls Saturday and Sunday nights from the large picture windows framing Mt. Orford.

Hats off to the *hardy* group of skiers who followed the Death March all weekend. We all skied *sous-bois* (in the woods) on Friday at Sutton with no lines and a little bit of fresh snow. On Saturday, who will ever forget the **'Waterfall**" at Mt. Orford (actually, trail #44) *Passé de L'Ours - Bear Pass*?

Our reentry into the US went quickly and the group was rewarded with the best glade skiing *ever* at Jay Peak, Vermont. At least 8 inches of fresh snow was waiting for us when we arrived. Remember these names: Bushwacker, Everglade, Bonaventure Glade, Beaver Pond Glade, Timbuktu?

#### ASPEN

Our second best snow trip of all time, behind only Utah in 1995 (April 13-21). On all but one of the seven ski days, we had powdery,  $20^{\circ}$ - $30^{\circ}$  winter conditions. Presentation was superb; dessert was simply delicious. Aspen closed for the season a week after we left with record base depths.


