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2006 Trip Recap

CRESTED BUTTE

After smooth travel we arrived at Crested Butte on December 26th. We were treated to perfect conditions all week. We didn't even need double layers under our jackets because temperatures were in the 20°s and 30°s all week. The T bar-accessed-extreme terrain was open and many accepted the challenge at least once. All green and blue trails were groomed every night. Wayne led those who "declared their intentions" on the Death March, lots of trees and nice soft bumps. Two to five inches of new snow greeted us all but one day. The finale was about eleven inches of fresh powder on New Year's Day. We didn't even come in for the Eagles game!

The Chateaux was comfortable walking distance if we used the metal staircase and checked our skis overnight. Condos were "gold rated" - lots of DVD players, games and well supplied kitchens. We enjoyed breakfast "in" and many relaxed in the condo for home cooked dinners.

The town was casual and very affordable. No traffic signal, even in the town, other than "the four way stop." For après ski every day at the *Avalanche*, you could find a Bucks Mount table. *Six-dollar pitchers* seemed to make us regulars. We had an awesome New Year's Eve party in the clubhouse with catered food and a few little drinking games. *See Evi's rap song on page 5*.

OKEMO AND SUNAPEE

To ski with Bucks Mount you must be a man or woman for all seasons and weather. Saturday at Sunapee it was pouring rain. The decision, however, was not whether to ski or stay in, but rather what size trash bag one should wear: 33 gallon or 55 gallon. We had five people actually *request* the Death March despite the drenching rain. We agreed to regroup at 12:30 in the cafeteria to reevaluate our plans. In spite of the warm weather, soft snow, and otherwise good conditions, Bucks Mount voted to return early to the Inn. In the cozy confines of the *Hartness House*,

happy hour turned into Happy Half Day and we were wonderfully liquored up for dinner.

That night, a cold front whacked us with heavy snow, wind and very cold temperatures. But the death marchees plodded on. The appetite for the pin is so insatiable that people are willing to put up with frostbite rather than ask to go in and risk forfeiting the coveted award. Ask Jennifer Logan. Her feet hurt so much when they started thawing out during the lunch break that it brought tears to her eyes.So on the second day the DML rested... To cap off the trip Bud, our driver, did his best imitation of the 55 Man Bobsled Run trying to ascend the hill up to the *Hartness House*; many volunteered to walk.

TIGNES/VAL D'ISERE

After 3 days of continuous snow, we awoke to a morning of blue sky and bright sunshine. Our guides Baudouin and Luc had arranged for us to be picked up in front of the hotel by two vans. We drove for 40 minutes back down the mountains to La Roziere, a small ski resort used mainly by French families. The views were spectacular along the way, with glimpses of the large ski resort Les Arcs across the valley. We bought a lift ticket for the combined resorts and also a key card that once placed in our pockets, allowed an easy swipe of the reader and we were up on the lifts. Our destination was the Italian resort of La Thuile. We skied thru the trails admiring the close up views of Mont Blanc and the distant Matterhorn. We skied into Italy unaware of the border crossing. The only evidence that we were now in another country was that the signs were written in Italian.

Near the bottom we took a secret off piste run that dropped us off at the door of a small country inn for lunch. The owner of the hotel greeted us and the menu was arranged. We had an anti pasta course of local cold cuts and sausages followed by 3 homemade pasta courses: pasta with a red pepper sauce and feta cheese, meat raviolis, and fettuccine with black truffles. Some dared to follow this with dessert! There were 9 of us and we had finished off 6 bottles of red wine. At the end of the lunch was the customary, on the house, bottles of both grappa and genepi. We polished off a half bottle of each! We then had to ski back into France and take the van ride back up to Tignes. It was a ski day to remember!

STOWE AND SUGARBUSH

Evi got us started Friday night on the bus with jello shots. That loosened everyone up. At the rest stop someone dropped her wallet in the toilet, giving new meaning to the expression *piss poor*. We learned that having too much fun in the back of the bus, can make one nauseated. Also, one of our members decided our bus was not fun enough. He boarded another bus that actually drove off before someone said, "You're not on this bus!"

The first day, at Sugarbush, we had three contenders for the Death March. They skied some very hard packed, mogully runs without a whimper. At Stowe on day two, the *front four* were open but they skied like *greased BBs*. Getting into the infamous Goat trail had to be the funniest thing Wayne ever witnessed. One by one the women disappeared as they slid down on their backs. "What a great day!"

ELK MOUNTAIN

It was a dismal forecast for that Friday early in February. No surprise, it was the Elk trip lead by our now fearless-DM pin winner- Rita. All other buses cancelled, not Bucks Mount. We like skiing in any conditions, although snow would be nice occasionally. But true to the unpredictability of this trip, at 9:30 am the rain stopped and wonderful spring conditions were enjoyed by all the rest of the day! Thanks, Rita.

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SUNDAY RIVER AND ATTITASH

Three for three. Our third New England weekend and more cold, windy, icy conditions with no glades open. Death Marchers earned their pins this season! Anyone can ski on soft snow with sunny skies and 25°. No Opportunists this year. Wayne's biggest surprise was that Rita joined us on Obsession, When questioned about her intentions, she said, "I'm here aren't I?" We had some teenagers stick like glue to the DML and upgrade their junior-child pins (1/2 day) to full adult status. There were about fifteen people in the group and they willingly followed until the end of day three at Attitash. Thank you, it was great fun!

MT. ORFORD, MT. SUTTON AND JAY PEAK

It is wonderful leaving in the afternoon (especially for retired people). The border crossings were uneventful once we swore to the agriculture inspector that we did not have any fruit or meat with us. For our first day it did rain some at Mt. Sutton, mostly after lunch. We had four pin winners on this trip. One of them, Manny, even commented, "I'm sitting here getting wet, but I'm having a *really* great time." (That was music to the ears of the DML.)

"Dramatic" attempts to describe the scenery we enjoyed during this trip to the Canadian Rockies. It was April 13th when we arrived at the front doors of the 400-room *Chateaux Lake Louise*. Snow flurries landed on our faces as the Alpine dressed valets helped us unload our vans. We had about 4 inches of new snow each of the first four nights of our trip. Our rooms were all upgraded to "lake view". We enjoyed luxury in the middle of a wilderness area, surrounded by lofty, stark, mountain peaks.

Skiing was excellent as we explored all the terrain of Lake Louise Ski Area. The Ptarmigan and Larch areas were favorites. Many took the opportunity to experience a dog sled ride. We traveled two per sled, mushing our teams ourselves, on the way back. Some also hiked the trail towards the Victoria Glacier, which feeds Lake Louise.

For our second four nights, our suitcases were moved for us to the 700room *Banff Springs Hotel*. Our upgraded views were again magnificent. We looked past the golf course and down the Bow River Valley to the town of Banff. Other grand windows framed additional lofty and historic peaks. Many of us walked the path to the waterfall during our stay. We enjoyed exploring the great rooms of the "Castle in the Rockies".

Sunshine Village ski area provided us with spring conditions after the snowy weather ended. Goat's Eye was a favorite here. During the drive back and forth to the hotel we were always on the lookout for wildlife. Many took a second day off to explore the hotel, the town, and the scenic areas along the Trans-Canada highway. They were even rewarded with elk, deer and big horn sheep sightings. Those who hiked the Johnston Canyons to the thawing waterfalls, loved it! Those who frequented the St. James Gate and Wild Bill's tayerns loved them, too.


Membership
