2009 Ski Trips

All day/weekend ski trips depart from 5 Municipal Way, Langhorne, PA 19047. This is the Middletown Township Police Building, which is two lights north of Maple Avenue (Rt. 213), off of North Flowers Mill Road. (directions and map on the web site). Prices include lift tickets, transportation on a lavatory-equipped bus, videos and refreshments on the bus, driver's tip, lodging, meals, and a box dinner on the return trip home. Friday departure times for weekend trips vary: Okemo 4:30 pm, Sunday River/Wildcat 4:00 pm and Killington 4:30 pm. Most accommodations can be priced for double, triple or quad occupancy. Indicate your choice on the waiver form.

Children 18 years or younger may qualify for rate reductions when staying with their parents. Agreements with lodges vary, so check with Maureen to see what is most beneficial to your family.

PLEASE NOTE that you must be a member to go on ski trips and you must fill out a color-coded waiver form with your initial deposit. If you make the required 50% deposit 60 days in advance of the trip, you receive a \$10 discount off of the total cost of each weekend trip and are entered in the raffle for a \$100 discount. Balance is due a minimum of 2 weeks prior to departure.

Rates listed are per person, tax and gratuities included.

OKEMO, VERMONT

January 16 - 18

Ski 2 days. We are looking forward to going back for the sixth time to the <u>Hartness House</u>, Vermont's historic inn, originally the home of James Hartness, inventor, astronomer and Governor of Vermont in 1920. Located in Springfield, VT minutes off I-91, we have always enjoyed the Victorian atmosphere of the original house. The sitting areas with windows seats, couches, fireplaces and bar offer comfortable areas for us to gather. The innkeepers will keep up the festive holiday garlands and trees for us this year. 

Treasurer's Report

Once again its time to provide the club with the yearly Treasurer's Report to keep you informed of our financial condition.

Although the 2007-2008 season was a successful skiing year for the Club, it was financially, a non-eventful year, which is good. The club absorbed a small loss of approximately \$600 for the past season. The net loss was small but the purpose of the club is not to make money. Our mission is to give all members of the club an opportunity to participate in ski trips at a reasonable cost. This is something that our Trip Director works very hard to accomplish. Thank you Maureen!!

Here are some financial highlights from the past season. All funds received for last season were approximately \$206,931, while expenses incurred were about \$207,539. As would be expected, our biggest income and expense items were the ski trips. Trip income was just over \$199,448 and expenses were about \$193,261. Other Club income that is derived from membership dues and 50-50 money was approximately \$3,953. Other Club expenses include

bank charges, postal charges, EPSC membership, telephone, newsletter, trip assistance, meetings, social events and other miscellaneous expenses. These expenses were approximately \$10,478. Naturally, the newsletter and meetings are the biggest expenses because this is how we communicate and have fun (or should I say eat) when we are not skiing. The good news is the net gain from the ski trips was able to absorb most of the net loss from our non-trip expenses and provide the Club with a minor net loss of approximately \$600.

The Club currently has approximately \$8,000 in its treasury. This money allows the Club to fund lodging and bus deposits prior to members signing up for future trips.

As always, the books are open for inspection if you would like to see exact amounts for each category of income and expense. Bring you own No-Doze!! Please call ahead for an appointment.

On Board! The Life of a Knuckle Dragger Part II by Jason "Jaspoon" Krenzel informed us of the fashion for snowboarders. "There isn't a snowboarder on the mountain that would be caught dead in a ski parka! In fact all snowboarders must wear a two-peace suit."

Bucks Mount Ski Club - The Beginning (1969): Abbey Feinberg was the Club's first president. A friend of hers, Joe Gross, who worked for the *Courier Times*, helped her put an article in the paper about forming a ski club. Anyone interested was to meet at Abbey's house on Fallenrock Road in Levittown. About 15 interested people showed up and the Club was formed. There was a contest to create a name for the group. The winning name was actually Bucks Mont, named for the neighboring counties Bucks and Montgomery. However, it was decided to change "Mont" to "Mount" since skiing is done on mountains, even though there were no mountains in Bucks County. A 1972 bus trip to Elk cost \$13, which included a deluxe bus and lift tickets!
