2010 Ski Trips

All day/weekend ski trips depart from 5 Municipal Way, Langhorne, PA 19047. This is the Middletown Township Police Building, which is two lights north of Maple Avenue (Rt. 213), off of North Flowers Mill Road. (directions and map on the web site). Prices include lift tickets, transportation on a lavatory-equipped bus, videos and refreshments on the bus, driver's tip, lodging, meals, and a box dinner on the return trip home. Friday departure times for weekend trips vary: Loon Mountain, Bretton Woods, Waterville Valley 4:00 pm, Sunday River/Wildcat 4:00 pm and Stowe 4:30 pm. Most accommodations can be priced for double, triple or quad occupancy. Indicate your choice on the waiver form.

Children 18 years or younger may qualify for rate reductions when staying with their parents. Agreements with lodges vary, so check with Maureen to see what is most beneficial to your family.

PLEASE NOTE that you must be a member to go on ski trips and you must fill out a color-coded waiver form with your initial deposit. If you make the required 50% deposit 60 days in advance of the trip, you receive a \$10 discount off of the total cost of each weekend trip and are entered in the raffle for a \$100 discount. Balance is due a minimum of 2 weeks prior to departure.

Rates listed are per person, tax and gratuities included.

LOON MOUNTAIN, BRETTON WOODS, WATERVILLE VALLEY, NEW HAMPSHIRE January 15 - 18



Treasurer's Report

The Bucks Mount Ski & Snowboard Club Year 2008-2009 Financial Report. It's time to provide the Club with the yearly Treasurer's Report to keep you informed of our financial condition.

The 2008-2009 ski season was a financially good year for the Club. Our income was almost identical to our expenses. The net income was small but the purpose of the Club is not to make money but to enjoy the skiing. Our mission is to give all members of the Club an opportunity to participate in ski trips at a reasonable cost. I believe we have completed this goal. This is something that our Trip Director works very hard to accomplish. Once again we need to thank Maureen for accomplishing this task!

Here are some financial highlights from the past season. All funds received from last season were approximately \$109,300, while expenses incurred were about \$109,000. As would be expected, our biggest income and expenses items were for the ski trips. Trip income was almost

\$103,600 and expenses were about \$100,200. Other Club income, not directly related to an expense, is derived from membership dues and 50-50 money and was approximately \$3,500. Other Club expenses included bank charges, postal charges, EPSC membership, telephone, newsletter, meetings and other miscellaneous expenses that are intended to offset each other for the most part with some subsidy by the Club. Naturally, the newsletter and meetings are the biggest expenses because this is how we communicate and have fun (or should I say eat) when we are not skiing.

The Club currently has approximately \$9,000 in its treasury. This money allows the Club to fund lodging and bus required deposits prior to members signing up for trips.

As usual, the books are open for inspection. Please call ahead for an appointment so you don't interfere with the Treasurer's nap time.

Barb Zurlo wrote an article about the various places for better dining while skiing Sunday River.


In a more active time, a golf outing was planned at the Middletown Country Club.
